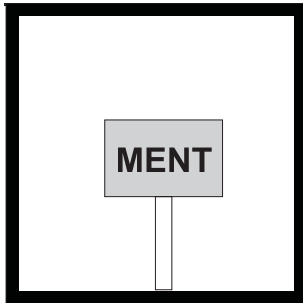

No names on Saints sex claim

St Kilda coach Ross Lyon refused today to name the two players alleged to have had sex with a high school student, who is now pregnant.

Lyon said he would not judge the players' alleged actions but said the pair, who were stressed, had "fully co-operated" with questioning by the club and AFL.

Lyon said he was made aware of the situation only yesterday after allegations came to light that two of his players had slept with a 17-year-old high school student they had first met at a school clinic in the outer suburbs of Melbourne.

The girl is said to have re-introduced herself to the players after the club's Round 1 match in Sydney, before sleeping with them both in the ensuing weeks.

In Sydney, the girl allegedly told the players she was 18. The players claim her Facebook page suggests she is 19.

The legal age of consent in Victoria is 16.

"They are obviously handling some level of stress," Lyon said. "But... we're not making any judgments."

A Victoria Police spokeswoman said police knew about the matter but no official complaint had been made.

A spokesman for the Victorian Department of Education said it too was aware of the matter and had taken steps to support the student and her family.

The AFL has launched an investigation and met the two Saints players at AFL House today.

A player at a rival club has also been linked to the matter.

Lay denies fines push

Victoria's top traffic cop says he has never been pressured to raise cash from speed cameras.

Deputy commissioner Ken Lay said the Government had "never once mentioned revenue to me".

"(The State) Government wouldn't speak to me about revenue. I simply do not care about the revenue," Lay told 3AW today.

His comments come after Assistant Commissioner Luke Cornelius reportedly claimed he was pressured into fining motorists even though they were caught by faulty speed cameras.

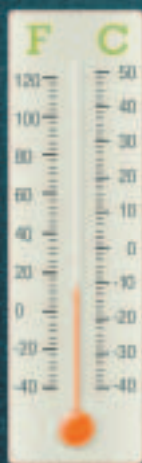
Jailed over QBH bashing

A Roxburgh Park man involved in the fatal bashing of a man at a Melbourne nightclub has been jailed for eight years.

Andriyas Tello, 22, pleaded guilty to the manslaughter of Matthew McEvoy, 24, who died after a fight at the QBH on September 7, 2008.

The Victorian Supreme Court was told Tello punched McEvoy twice in the head before his friends joined the attack.

He is the last of four young men to be sentenced over the fight.
